1:00 P.M. Call to Order – Mike Samson, Chairman Approval of November 18, 2020 AGNC EDD Minutes

Workforce Impacts of COVID-19 – Carolyn Tucker, Regional Business Services Coordinator, Colorado Workforce Center

Carolyn Tucker gave a presentation (attached) regarding the status of the Northwest Workforce Area. She noted that women are having to leave the workforce temporarily because of the unavailability of schools and childcare due to the pandemic.

Report on EDD Activities:

Coal to Products Project Update – Jeremiah Riley, Joshua Riley, and Nathan Perry provided an update on the Coal to Products project. The project is slated to be completed by the end of September. They are focusing on 6 counties: 3 in eastern Utah and 3 in northwest Colorado (Moffat, Rio Blanco, and Routt).

Additionally, the Uintah Group, led by Jeremiah Riley was selected to complete an Economic Recovery and Resilience Plan as a part of the CARES Act funding AGNC received to address the impacts of COVID-19.

Economic Development Coordinator Search --Bonnie is hoping to hire someone to fill this position by March 1. They will work on projects, funding, and grant-writing in coordination with the economic development organizations throughout the region.

Rural Jump Start Program for Western Garfield County –Western Garfield County (not including Carbondale and Glenwood Springs) will be considered at the February 18th EDC meeting for an exception which will allow them to apply for designation as a Rural Jumpstart zone. Two businesses, Springborn and Tiny Homes, are interested in pursuing designation through the program.

EDA COVID Relief Bill – Should the relief bill being considered in Congress pass, EDA anticipates receiving funding of about \$3 Billion. AGNC EDD members should consider opportunities they might wish to fund and begin to prepare grant ideas; it is hoped that this round of funding will also include the provision for an 80/20 match.

Partnership Planning Grant – We just completed our renewal paperwork and are applying for a 3-year grant cycle. We should hear about the grant approval by the end of March.

Broadband Discussion – There is a Zoom meeting on 2/26 at 10 am with Region 10 to discuss requests for broadband assistance utilizing the Region 10 Broadband network being placed from Montrose to Glenwood Springs.

ED Summit – Currently, staff plans to host an Economic Development Summit in August 2021 in Rifle, pending the status of COVID restrictions throughout the year.

 - 1 outdoor job fair in October 2020- 21 employers, 169 job seekers
 - April 8th, 2021 Grand Valley Career & Job Fair
 - · Partnering with CMU; will be an in-person outdoor event
- Onboarding Assistance
 - Career Development (WIOA)
 - On-the-Job Training (OJT)
 - Work Experience (paid internships)

New Program

- COResponds- putting dislocated workers back to work through temp positions that address the pandemic
 - Our funds cover wages and benefits for the temp employee; we reimburse the employer
 - o Employer agreement and employee eligibility must be completed prior to start date
