AGNC ELECTS NEW OFFICERS

GRAND JUNCTION, CO – The Associated Governments of Northwest Colorado elected new executive board officers at their monthly Board meeting held on Wednesday, April 24 at the Mesa County Workforce Center in Grand Junction.

Garfield County Commissioner Mike Samson was re-elected as the Association’s Chairman. Rio Blanco County Commissioner Jeff Eskelson, who served as AGNC’s Treasurer last year, was chosen to be the new Vice Chairman, replacing Routt County Commissioner Doug Monger. Monger, who said he will remain active with AGNC as the Boards representative for Routt County, did not seek re-election to the position.

Grand Junction City Council member and Mayor Pro-Tem Marty Chazen is the Association’s new Treasurer.

None of the positions were challenged, and the votes were unanimous.

AGNC’s Executive Director, Scott McInnis, praised Monger for his strong leadership role within AGNC over the past year.

“Doug Monger has been an invaluable asset to AGNC and served the Association well as Vice Chairman.

“AGNC has had a number of victories, including securing the distribution of Federal Mineral Lease dollars that were hidden in a state fund, and those victories were due in large part to strong leadership within the organization, of which Doug was a key part.”
